Course Description: This course provides training and resources for personnel who require advanced application of ICS. It is designed to elevate the student's understanding of the Incident Command System from a basic level up to an intermediate level.

Target Audience: Individuals who may assume a supervisory role in expanding incidents where some or all of the Command and General Staff positions may be activated and extend into multiple operational periods. To include but not limited to; EMS, hospital leadership, fire, public health, law, EMA, emergency dispatchers, public works, disaster responders, school administration and elected officials.

Pre-requisites: The course expands upon information covered in the ICS100, ICS200, ICS700 and ICS800 courses and must be completed prior to participating in ICS300 Intermediate level training.

Objectives:

- Describe the incident/event management process for supervisors and expanding incidents as prescribed by the Incident Command System (ICS).
- Describe how incidents can best be managed by appropriate and early designation of primary staff members and by delegating authority to the lowest practical level.
- Describe how Unified Command functions on a multi-jurisdictional or multi-agency incident.
- Describe the process for developing incident objectives, strategies, and tactics.
- Describe the strategy meeting, tactics meeting, planning meeting, operational period briefing, and team meeting.
- Identify and describe basic principles of resource management.
- Identify the impact of agency-specific policies, procedures, and agreements upon
