



Board Licensure of Healthcare Professionals



Why is licensure of health care professionals important to Iowans?

In the past year, nearly every Iowan has relied on a health care professional or business regulated by the boards of the Iowa Department of Public Health. You expect those health care providers and technicians to be competent, courteous and professional. IDPH works to protect the public and improve access to quality health services through the administration of 23 professional licensing boards that license and enforce competency standards for those health care providers.

All Iowans deserve ethical and safe health care from competent and qualified practitioners. Licensing is an effective way to keep untrained and dishonest individuals from practicing in any of our health care professions. Licensing boards also set and enforce rules to ensure practitioners qualified to be licensed maintain minimum standards of practice.

Did you know?

There are nearly 150,000 licensed health care professionals active in Iowa, regulated by 23 separate licensing boards whose members are appointed by the governor and confirmed by the Iowa Senate.

A focus on health equity

By maintaining and enforcing licensing and practice standards, the IDPH professional licensing boards ensure the health care available to all Iowans is competent and ethical.

What does the department do?

Processes applications for initial licensure, license renewal and reactivation of licenses. Each year, over 4,000 new license applications and 23,000 renewal applications are processed in the Bureau of Professional Licensure alone.

- The Board of Nursing regulates the licensure and practice of nurses.
- The Board of Medicine regulates physicians with active Iowa medical licenses, physicians with active administrative licenses, and acupuncturists.
- The Dental Board licenses and regulates over dental professionals, including dentists, dental hygienists and dental assistants.
- The Board of Pharmacy licenses and regulates actively licensed pharmacists, actively licensed pharmacies and other businesses, as well as individuals and businesses actively involved in prescription drug distribution.
- Coordinates examinations for licensure, when required.
- Address all disciplinary complaints and implements discipline when warranted.
- Conducts continuing education audits.
- Administers monitoring programs for practitioners with substance abuse or mental health problems and helps them return to practice as soon as it is safe to do so.
- Promulgates rules and regulations to carry out the mandate of laws passed by the legislature and approved by the governor.
- Provides licensure and discipline records to the public, employers and credentialers.
- Monitors national health care trends.



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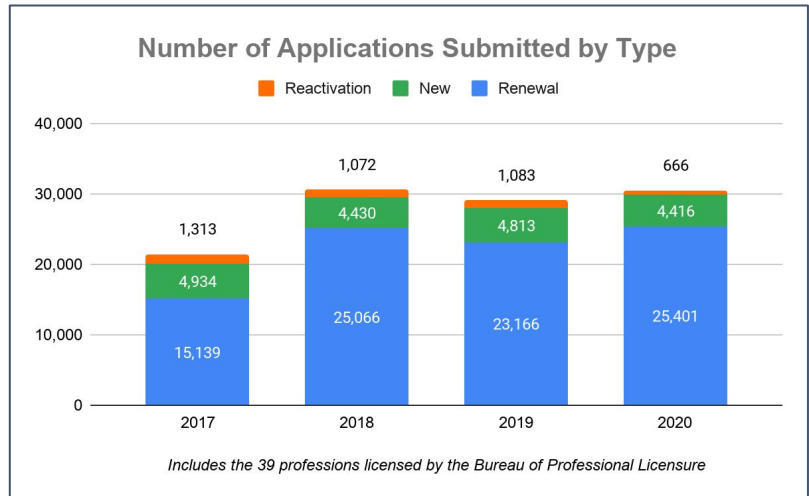


What can Iowans do to help?
