

2010 Legislative Session Summary of Enacted Bills of Public Health Interest

Overview:

- 194 bills sent to the governor.
- Of the 194 bills, 187 signed with no changes.
- Of the 194 bills, 6 signed after being line-item vetoed and 1 vetoed in its entirety.

This is consistent with the timeframes for other death certifications.</p> <p>Section 2.
