

## FY21 Community Partnership Tobacco Control Program Objectives

All 33 Community Partnerships (CPs) address the following Minimum Requirements (MR) in their tobacco control program:

- MR 1 Goal 1: Tobacco Free and Nicotine Free (TF/NF) policy change programming for either: parks, K-12 schools, childcare, or colleges/universities/community colleges/trade schools or development of an ISTEP Chapter.
- MR 2 Goal 2: TF/NF wellness worksite, community events, or smoke free housing policies.
- MR 3 Goal 3: Promote system change related to promoting quitting among young people and adults.
- MR 4: Coalition Development (work with their communities to implement initiatives to mobilize communities and to integrate tobacco control strategies into collaborative community activities).
