

INTEGRATED TESTING SERVICES SNAPSHOT

HIV Screening: 2019

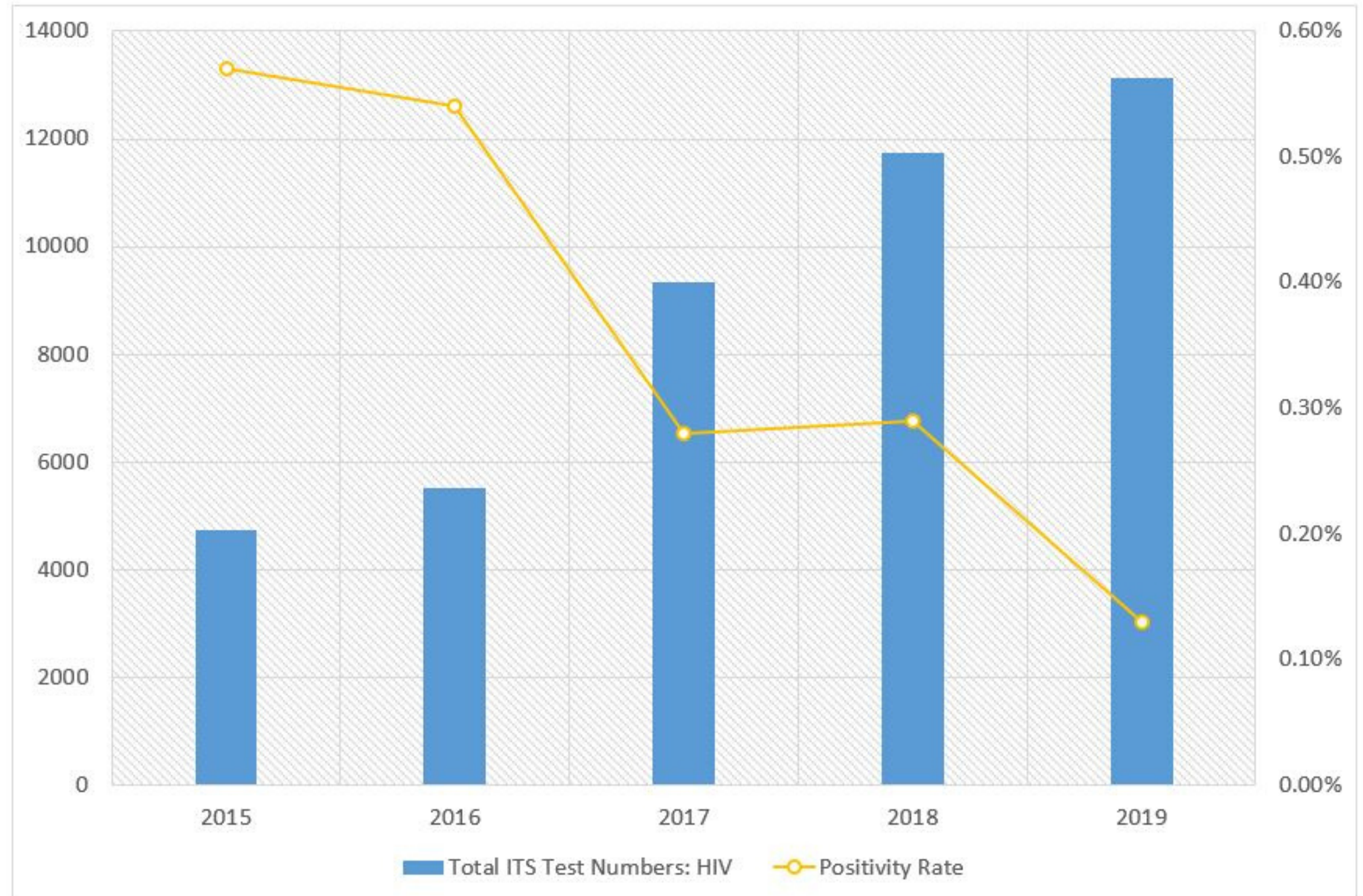
The Integrated Testing Services (ITS) program continued the trend of increasing rapid screening for HIV in 2019 with 13,141 rapid tests administered across the 12 participating agencies.

This represents an increase of 12% over 2018 and an increase of 178% over 2015.

While screening numbers have increased overall, the number of newly diagnosed persons living with HIV remained relatively stable across the five-year period, resulting in a declining overall positivity rate.

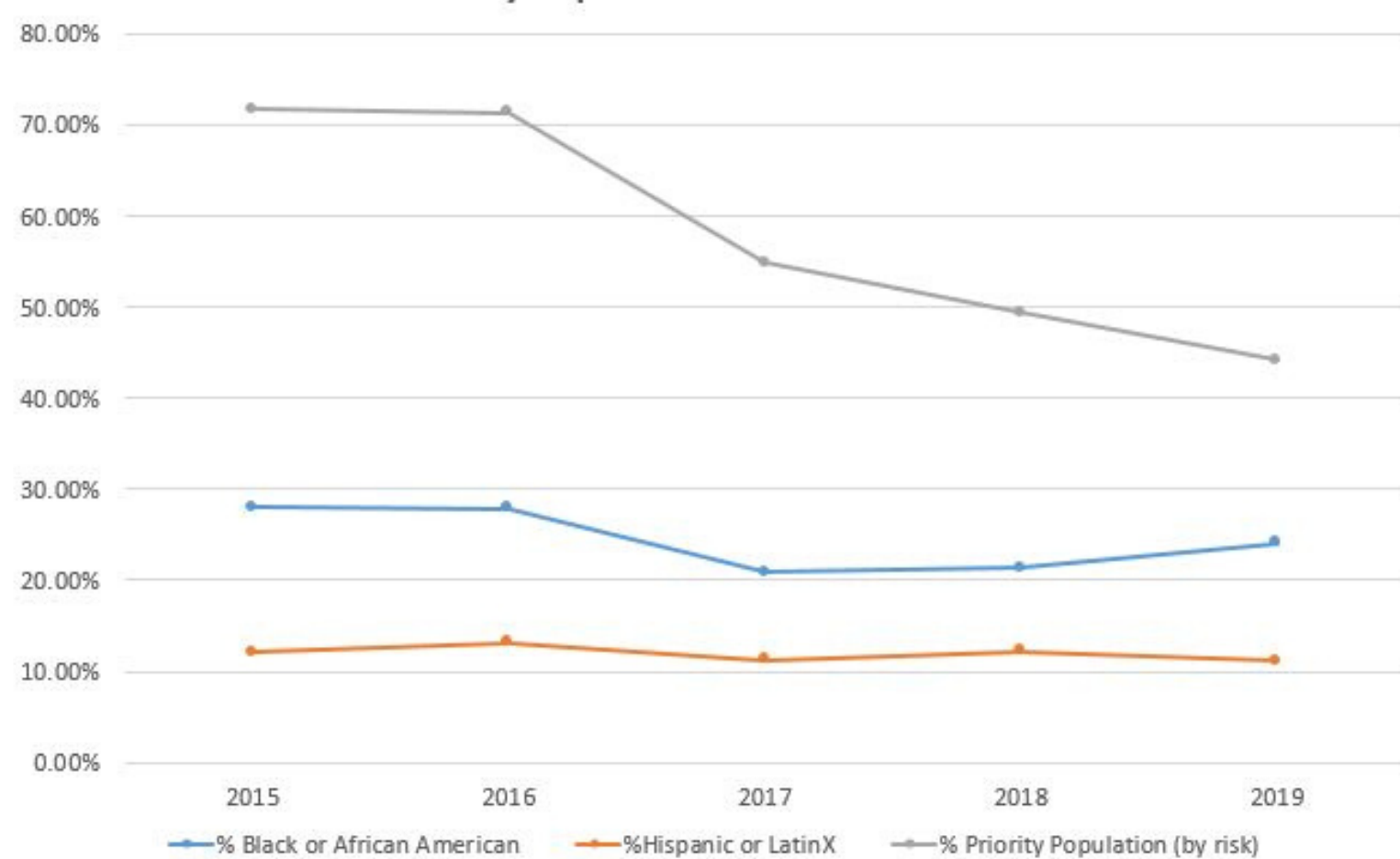
As we work to identify the 14% of Iowans living with HIV who do not yet know their statuses, we anticipate a continuation of increased testing and declining positivity rates.

Total ITS Testing Numbers: HIV

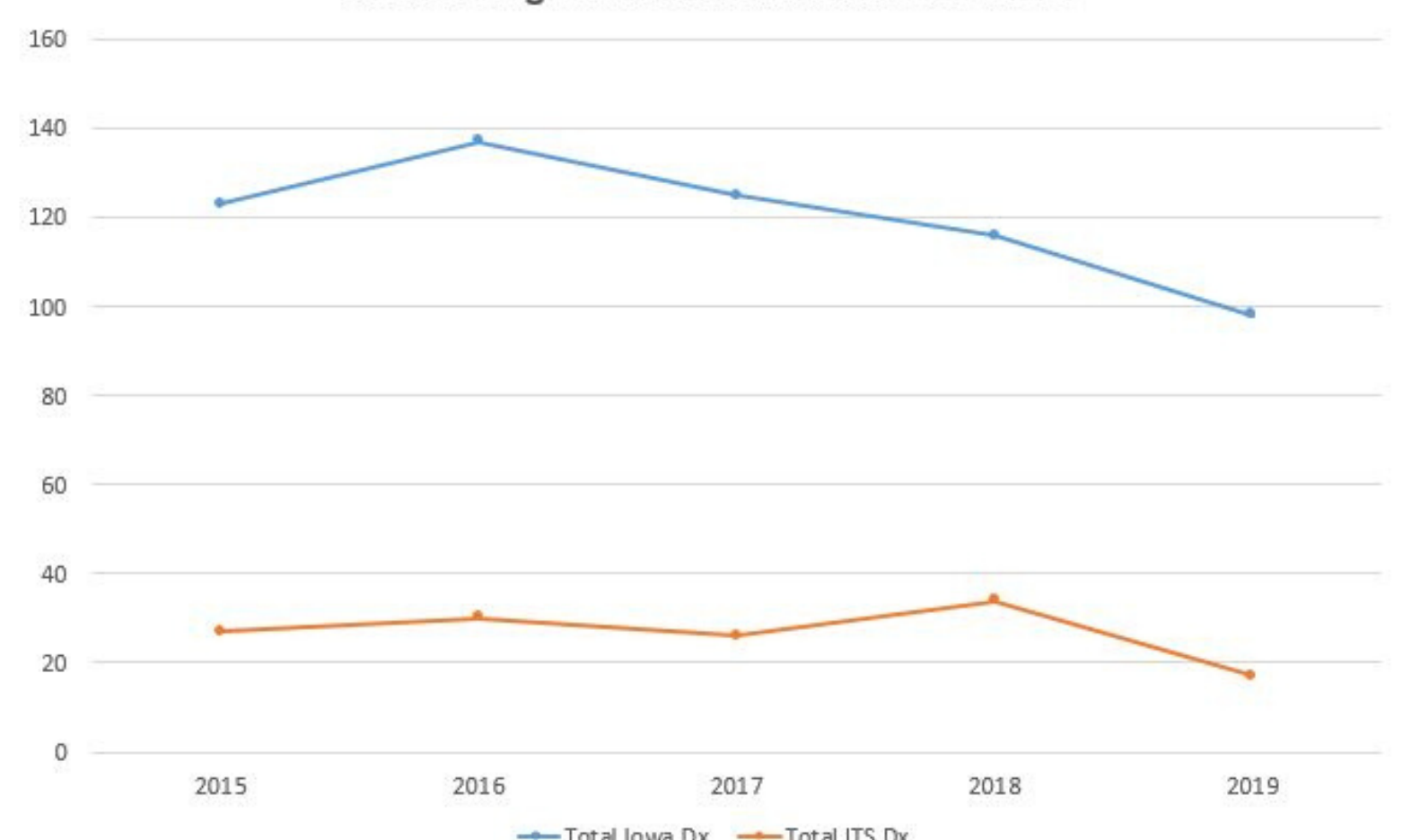

ITS HIV Diagnoses vs. State Total 2015 -2019



Over the five-year period presented here, the percentage of total tests administered to priority populations by risk has decreased from 72% in 2015 to 44% in 2019. This decline is due to previous program requirements that restricted services to disproportionately impacted and other priority populations. These restrictions were eliminated in 2017. **The percentage of total tests administered to disproportionately impacted populations (regardless of risk) has remained relatively stable over the five-year period with 24% of tests being administered to Black or African American individuals in 2019 (compared to the five-year average of 24%) and 11% administered to Hispanic or LatinX individuals (compared to the five-year average of 12%).** The proportion of newly diagnosed individuals living with HIV in the state of Iowa identified through ITS program activities also remained relatively stable at 17% of new diagnosis in Iowa in 2019 (as compared to the five-year average of 22%).
