



IDPH Preparedness, EMS, and Trauma Update

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Partnership Development Workshop Registration

The Bureau of Emergency and Trauma Services (BETS) is excited to announce that registration is open for the Partnership Development Workshops happening in May and June.

- NIMS compliance statement
- End-of-Year Capability Implementation Checklist

The above items should be completed and submitted to John Hallman via lowagrants.gov correspondence no later than June 30, 2016. Check with your coalition planner if you need assistance completing these requirements.

Also, Program and performance measure data will be sent out in early July, and will be due back to IDPH in mid-august.

County CHNA & HIP Snapshots and Progress Reports

Local boards of health are responsible for leading a community-wide discussion with stakeholders about their community's health needs and what can be done to address them (CHNA&HIP). In February 2016, counties submitted new snapshots of the outcomes of this planning process. Mason City EMS Medication Vending Machine Success Story

The Mason City Fire Department EMS division recently made a change to their medication vending machine system. Each time a manufacturer changed the package size, or a different product was substituted, the machine had to be reconfigured to accommodate the different size product. The service developed a carrier system with color coding to eliminate machine changes with each package change.
