
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



Practices, Systems: The actual application or use of an idea, belief, method, or policy


Places, Environments: The surroundings or conditions in which a person, animal, or plant lives or operates





GOAL SETTING

Specific (simple, sensible, significant)

Measurable (meaningful, motivating)

Achievable (agreed, attainable)

Relevant (reasonable, realistic and resourced, results-based)

Time bound (time-based, time limited, time/cost limited, timely, time-sensitive)

Inclusive Does this goal invite traditionally excluded individuals to make decisions and contribute in a way that shares power?

Equitable Does this goal include an element of fairness or justice that seeks to address systemic injustice, inequity, or oppression?

EXAMPLES F2S

3rd grade has a nutrition educator visit each classroom monthly

4th & 5th grade class record the number of fruits and vegetable they eat for a month

Garden club is offered for 6 weeks in the spring after school at the middle school

FFA student have a booth at a family event to promote the program

A school building hosts a farmers market during for all of the students to visit during specials

A farmer visits an all-school assembly

Nutrition services is required to track and report local foods purchases

Schools who procure local foods get an increase in state reimbursement through CACFP or NSLP

The School Improvement Plan includes goals for a community garden

District science curriculum includes a unit that involved growing seeds in the classroom

Classroom handbook requires parents to sign up for a week of garden maintenance

The school wellness policy includes goals for local foods

A school food service direct tracks the amount of local food purchases

Local food coordinators help communicate with food serve and local farmers to increase procurement

Teachers take students in the garden during science class during plant units

Schools use garden for family nights as stated in the school improvement plan

Food service training includes skills for preparing and cooking local ingredients

School kitchens have equipment needed to cook and prepare raw ingredients

A community partner creates a garden space available to the school to use

A food distribution center expands their delivery zone to include a new school district

Classroom sets up an indoor grow light

Community values hands-on garden education



EXAMPLES PA

4th grade teacher used Yoga 4 Classrooms for 2 weeks

Kindergarten uses Go Noodle during indoor recess one day

A 6week running program afterschool

PTO holds a fun run fundraiser

Local Wellness Policy prohibits the removing recess for academic or behavioral discipline

Shared use agreement allows community to walk halls before school

Classroom rules state that birthdays will be celebrated by being the line leader and picking a game for the class to play at the end of the day

Schools schedule includes recess before lunch for grade K-2

Yoga is used for all morning meetings during the year

Established walking school bus routes and volunteers are available most days

2nd grade teacher walks laps with students during recess

PE teacher lead an annual professional development for all school staff to lean ways to incorporate physical activity

PTO raises funds to put in a new walking track

Principal praises classroom for use of movement during math

Nurse put up bulletin board that promotes physical activity

Sensory walks are added to hallways

Classrooms add standing desks
